

# How do I know if my pet's teeth need cleaning?



#### Ask yourself the following questions:

Yes No
[ ] [ ] Is your pet over three years old?
[ ] [ ] Does your pet have bad breath?
[ ] [ ] Do your pet's teeth (especially the molars) have a yellow or brown discoloration?

[ ] Are your pet's gums red or bleeding?

If you answered "Yes" to any of the above questions, your pet is probably suffering from some degree of dental or periodontal disease. Periodontal disease is more than just dirty teeth. If untreated it can cause serious health problems including organ failure.

W Antibiotic injection to prevent bacterial spread to vital organs
